

GOD AND HIS CREATION

This month we are focusing on the Psalms. This book includes many poems and songs that help us understand more about who God is and how he works in our lives. It also teaches us that it is important to have a relationship with God, who has created the world and everything in it.



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Read Psalm 23 to learn about how Jesus is our shepherd. Try to memorize the verse highlighted in the *Words to Treasure* feature and read more about what God is like in the *Life in Bible Times* feature.

What God Is Like

Psalm 23 says that God is like a shepherd. A shepherd loves and cares for his sheep. He watches them closely, protects them from danger, and makes sure they have enough to eat and drink. To say that God is our shepherd means that he

watches over us and will show us what is best for us.



Read Psalm 46 and the devotion *God, Our Castle* which reminds us of God’s unfailing strength. When we rely on him, we don’t need to be afraid!

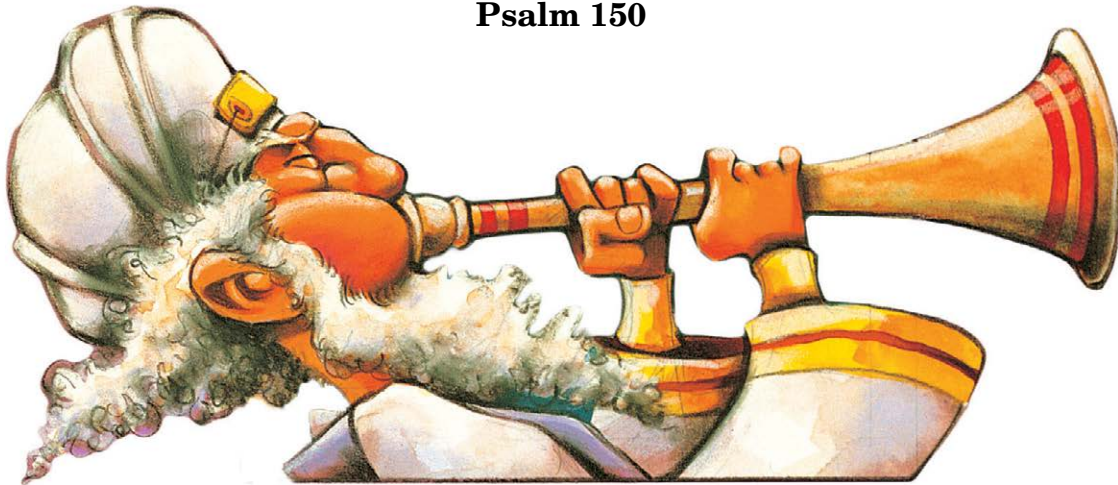

DOESN'T GOD EVER GET TIRED OF ANSWERING PRAYERS?

Nope. God never gets even a little bit tired of answering prayers. He loves to hear from us because he loves us. Jesus died for our sins so we would be forgiven for the wrong things we've done—and to be friends with him. Those things never change. No matter how often we ask things of him, he will listen.

God wants to work in our lives to change our behavior, thoughts, and habits. We should never fear that we are wearing him out with our prayers. You can even pray about the same thing because God wants to be a part of our lives and hear from us all the time.

How to Pray

How do I START?

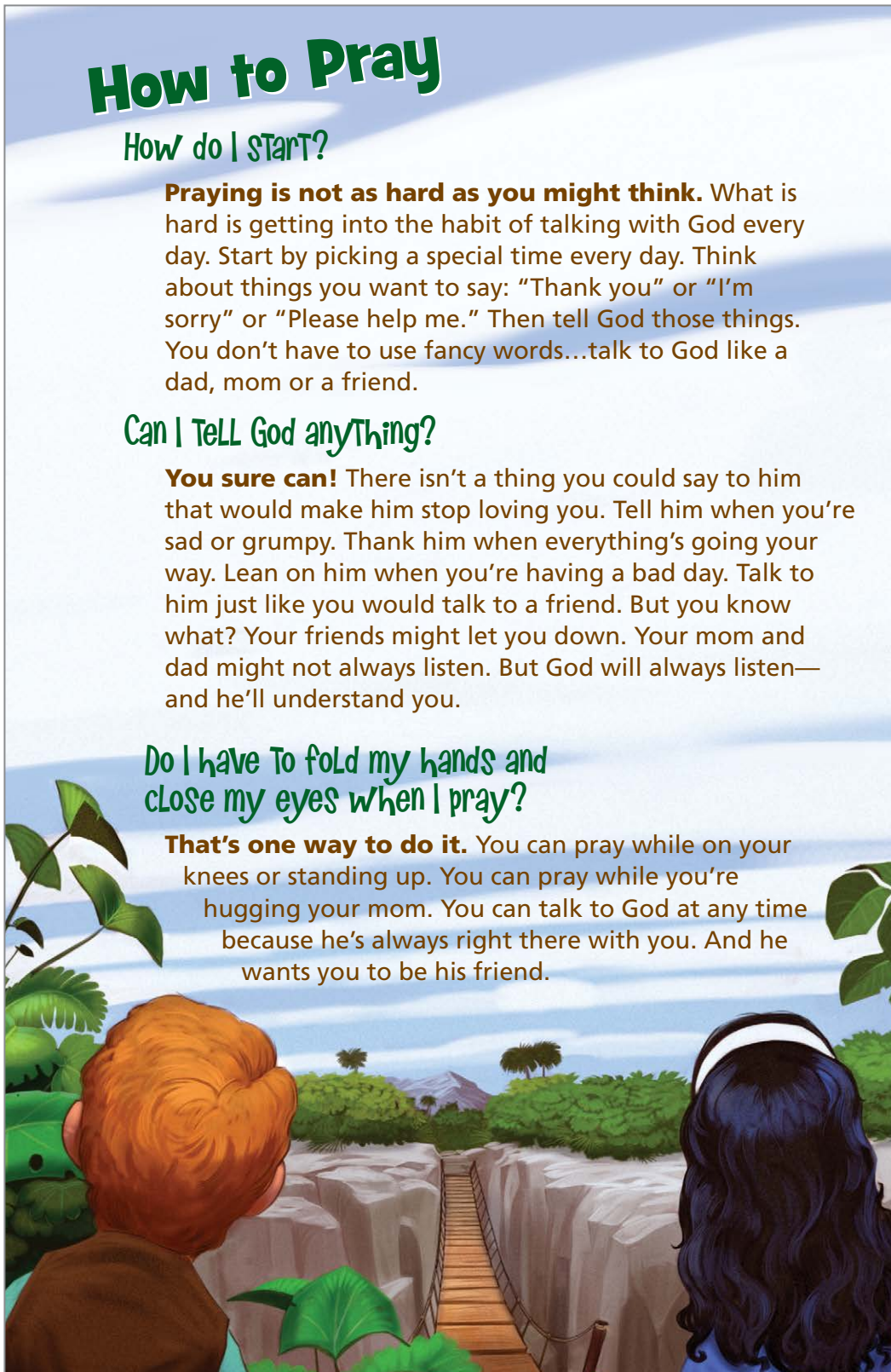
Praying is not as hard as you might think. What is hard is getting into the habit of talking with God every day. Start by picking a special time every day. Think about things you want to say: “Thank you” or “I’m sorry” or “Please help me.” Then tell God those things. You don’t have to use fancy words...talk to God like a dad, mom or a friend.

Can I TELL God anyThing?

You sure can! There isn’t a thing you could say to him that would make him stop loving you. Tell him when you’re sad or grumpy. Thank him when everything’s going your way. Lean on him when you’re having a bad day. Talk to him just like you would talk to a friend. But you know what? Your friends might let you down. Your mom and dad might not always listen. But God will always listen—and he’ll understand you.

Do I have To fold my hands and close my eyes when I pray?

That’s one way to do it. You can pray while on your knees or standing up. You can pray while you’re hugging your mom. You can talk to God at any time because he’s always right there with you. And he wants you to be his friend.

no matter how we feel.**



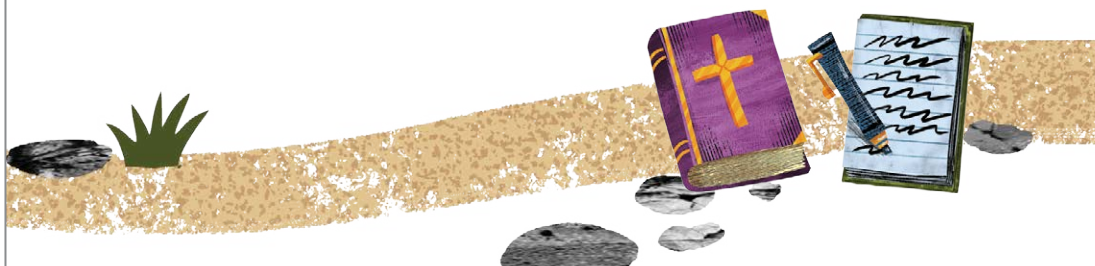
Do you have a best friend? If you do, you may love to explore together. You probably spend a lot of time talking to each other. You like to share your thoughts and ideas. Best friends trust each other too. That's the kind of relationship God wants with his people!

God wants his people to spend time with him. God wants them to trust him. He wants them to share their thoughts, ideas, and feelings with him. That's true whether things are good or bad. And God even wants his people to share their biggest secrets with him! That's the kind of relationship God wants with his people.

Psalms are one way God's people in the Old Testament talked with him. God's people today can use these same words. They can be used by anyone when they talk with God. The psalms teach us about who God is and what he has done. They also help us talk to God about our deepest feelings and emotions. And we can do that when we're happy, when we're sad, or even when we're angry. Psalms help God's people talk with him no matter how they're feeling! Like a best friend, God just wants to hear from us!

What are some of the things you talk to God about? Do you feel better after you talk to him?

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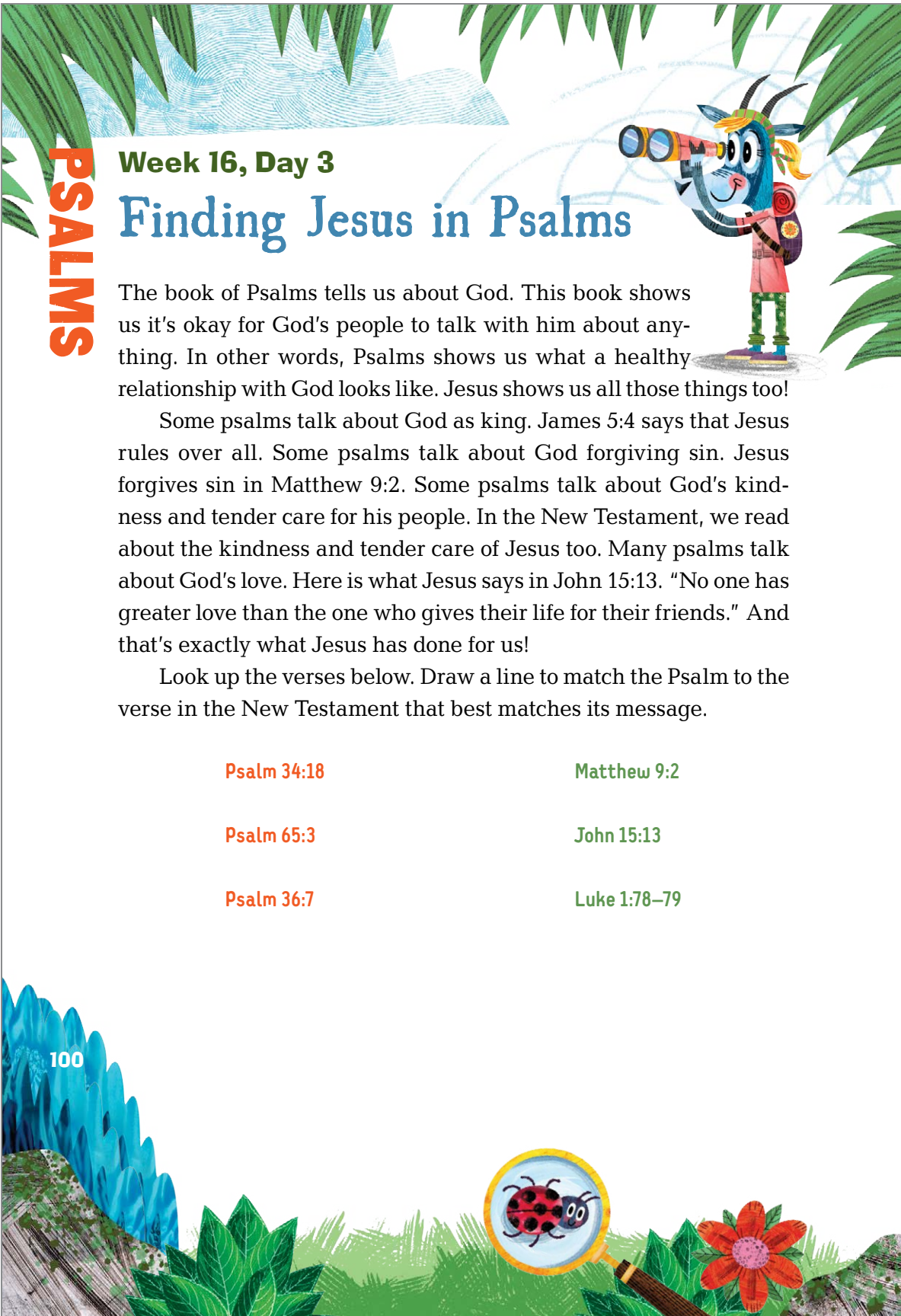

PSALMS

The Psalms are poems. They are like some poems because they talk about feelings and emotions. But the Psalms are different from other poems because all the Psalms focus on God. They tell us who God is and what he does. They also tell God who we are and how we're feeling. Many different people wrote the Psalms. They all talked about their emotions and feelings with God.

Now it's your turn to write your own psalm. Begin by deciding what emotion or feeling you want to talk to God about. Think about how you will say it. Write that on the first line. Then think about what God has done for you. Write about that on the second line. Remember, it doesn't have to rhyme. It just has to be honest! This is only the beginning. Write as many lines as you want. God wants to hear from you! When you're done writing your psalm, put it away someplace safe. It is a private talk between you and God.

PSALM 23 MEMORY BOOKLET

STUFF YOU NEED:

- Unlined paper
- Three-hole punch
- Brass fasteners
- Pencils, crayons or markers
- Whiteboard and dry-erase marker

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Write Psalm 23 on the board.
2. Use the three-hole punch on the unlined paper, allotting at least five sheets per child (you may want to make extras, just in case more are needed).
3. Explain to children the process in which early Bible writers would copy Scripture by hand in order to share it with others. These people were often called scribes. Ancient copies of Scripture were often elaborately decorated around the edges. The early Bible scribes believed the Word of God was beautiful, so they wanted the copies to be beautiful as well.
4. Give your child the following instructions:
 - a. To help you memorize Psalm 23, you are going to copy it the way ancient scribes might have. Write very neatly, putting only a few lines of Scripture on each page.
 - b. After you are done writing, take time to decorate the edges and corners to show everyone how beautiful the Word of God is.
 - c. Assemble their pages using the brass fasteners to create a beautiful booklet to help them memorize this passage of Scripture.

Psalm 23 tells us how Jesus is a shepherd to us. This activity will help us reflect on how he works in our lives and keeps us on the right path.

THE LORD IS MY PERSONAL SHEPHERD

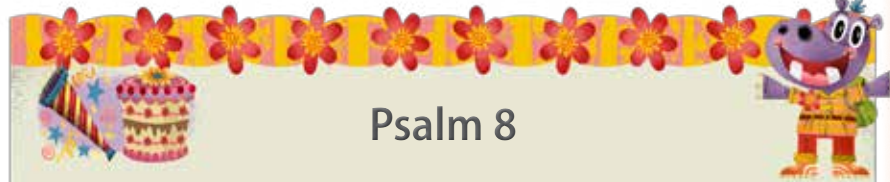
STUFF YOU NEED:

- Notebook paper
- Pencils

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Have the words to Psalm 23 on a piece of paper for your children to see.
2. Explain that when any writer writes a song or poem, they are trying to express their personal feelings. Psalm 23 is a very personal, beautiful song that David wrote about his own life.
3. Give each child a few pages of notebook paper and some pencils.
4. Encourage your children to rewrite parts of Psalm 23 to reflect something personal to them. For example, instead of the line "He lets me lie down in fields of green grass," they can think up something that is true to your life, such as, "He helps me be patient with my sister."
5. Give them time to work on rewriting Psalm 23.
6. Ask them to share their personalized Psalm 23 with you or family.

There are so many things around us that God has created. Read Psalm 8, and then do this activity to celebrate the beauty God has placed around us.

In this psalm, David thinks of all the wonderful things the Lord has made.

Joinme says get your group together. Work together to make a large collage about our world. Find pictures of all the things that you read about in the psalm. Or you can draw them. Paste them on a poster or a large piece of paper. It doesn't matter if there are two pictures of the same thing. Make sure that the poster is covered with pictures. Then write the words of verse 9 with a marker across your collage.
